## **Discussion:**

A city-initiated ordinance amendment to the Locust Grove Municipal Code Section 5.28.065- Alcohol License Distance Restrictions. The proposed amendment consists of modifications to the area exempt from alcohol licensing distance restrictions for On-Premise Consumption and the addition of a map displaying the exempt area. As it currently reads, the HPDO (Historic Preservation District Overlay) serves as the exempt area. The proposed modification specifies the exempt area as separate from the HPDO, making the ordinance more functional and expanding the area to include areas of potential development/redevelopment.

TO AMEND TITLE 5 - BUSINESS TAXES, LICENSES AND REGULATIONS: AMENDING CHAPTER 5.28.065 - CERTAIN AREAS EXEMPT FROM DISTANCE RESTRICTIONS FOR SALE CONSUMPTION ON PREMISES: TO PROVIDE FOR APPLICABILITY; TO PROVIDE FOR CODIFICATION; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; TO REPEAL INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS: TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE: AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

#### THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCUST GROVE HEREBY ORDAINS

SECTION 1. Title 5, Chapter 5.28.065 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Locust Grove Georgia is hereby amended by deleting subparagraph 1 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

1. Any property located within the Alcohol Ord 5.28.65 Exempt Area, map dated January 4, 2023 as attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A".

SECTION 2. Codification. This ordinance shall be codified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State of Georgia.

#### **SECTION 3. Severability.**

A. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are and were, upon their enactment, believed by the City Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.

B. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other Section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the City Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other Section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of Ordinance.

C. In the event that any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the City Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality, or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by

law, all remaining Sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable and of full force and effect.

**SO ORDAINED** this 6<sup>th</sup> day of February 2023.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Repeal of Conflicting Provision. Except as otherwise provided herein, all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption by the Mayor and Council of the City of Locust Grove.



## **Discussion:**

HFG Development, LLC of Stockbridge, GA requests an amendment to two zoning conditions for 31.43 +/- acres (Parcels: 111-01007000 (portion), 111-01007001, 111-01006051, and 111-01006052) located in Land Lot 233 of the 2<sup>nd</sup> District. The Properties are located on the west side of SR 42 between Colvin Drive and Pine Grove Road. The Properties were rezoned to M-1 (Light Manufacturing) in January 2022. Specifically, the applicant requests amendment to Condition No. 1 regarding façade materials and the removal of Condition No. 5 restricting the land use solely to warehousing and/or distribution.

## **Recommendation:**

Staff recommends DENIAL of the applicant's request for modification to Condition No. 1 regarding façade materials, which the applicant has agreed to not change at the Public Hearing.

Staff recommends APPROVAL of the applicant's request for the removal of Condition No. 5, with the understanding that the proposed land use must comply with the permitted uses listed in the City's Land Use Table under the M-1 zoning designation.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING CONDITIONS FOR 31.43+/-ACRES LOCATED ON HIGHWAY 42 (PARCELS 111-01007000 (portion), 111-01007001, 111-01006051, and 111-01006052) LOCATED IN LAND LOT 233 OF THE 2<sup>nd</sup> DISTRICT WITHIN THE CITY OF LOCUST GROVE, GEORGIA; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

**WHEREAS**, the City of Locust Grove ("City") is a municipal corporation, duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Georgia; and,

**WHEREAS**, HFG Development of Stockbridge, GA (the "Applicant"), requests an amendment to the existing zoning conditions for property located on Highway 42 (Parcels 111-01007000 (portion), 111-01007001, 111-01006051, and 111-01006052) located in Land Lot 233 of the 2<sup>nd</sup> District (the "Property), attached hereto as **Exhibit A**; and,

WHEREAS, the Applicant filed a request to amend the zoning conditions on December 5, 2022 as shown in the application attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as **Exhibit** B; and,

WHEREAS, the Properties were rezoned to M-1 (Light Manufacturing) with the following conditions:

- Plain painted, baked or acrylic finish corrugated metal panels shall be prohibited on all
  exterior walls unless otherwise approved by the Architectural Review Board, and then
  only as an accent feature. Primary facades shall be tilt-up concrete, brick, natural stone,
  glass with proper fenestration using color, materials and design to break up large
  expanses of wall space.
- 2. A lighting plan shall be submitted and approved prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy. This lighting plan shall detail cutoff-type fixtures on all buildings and in parking lots as well as a photometric plan.
- 3. The applicant shall be permitted to submit a stand-alone landscape plan for review by the City Council at a regularly scheduled meeting.

- 4. As many mature trees as possible located will be preserved and protected during construction, under the direction and supervision of a certified arborist, and remain preserved and protected when distribution operations commence.
- 5. The only permitted industrial uses on the site shall be warehouse and/or distribution.

**WHEREAS**, the Applicant's request has been reviewed by the Mayor and City Council at a Public Hearing held on January 17, 2023, as well as by the City Community Development Director; and,

WHEREAS, the Applicant requested that Condition No. 1 be amended to read as follows:

1. Plain painted, baked or acrylic finish corrugated metal panels shall be prohibited on all exterior walls unless otherwise approved by the Architectural Review Board, and then only as an accent feature. Primary facades, *front of road facing, shall be concrete*, brick, natural stone, glass with proper fenestration using color, materials and design to break up large expanses of wall space".; and,

WHEREAS, the Applicant requested that Condition No. 5 be removed in its entirety; and,

WHEREAS, notice of this matter (as attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit C) has been provided in accordance with applicable state law and local ordinances; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Council have reviewed and considered the Applicant's request and both the recommendations of the public hearing and City staff as presented in the Staff Report.

THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCUST GROVE HEREBY ORDAINS:







HFG requests a revision to Condition No. 1 to read as follows: "Plain painted, baked or acrylic finish corrugated metal panels shall be prohibited on all exterior walls unless otherwise approved by the Architectural Review Board, and then only as an accent feature. Primary facades, front of road facing, shall be concrete, brick, natural stone, glass with proper fenestration using color, materials and design to break up large expanses of wall space".

The applicant also requests that Condition No. 5 be removed in its entirety, as the condition currently limits the property's use to warehousing and/or distribution.

# Recommendations

Staff recommends DENIAL of the applicant's request for modification to Condition No. 1 regarding façade materials.

Staff recommends APPROVAL of the applicant's request for the removal of Condition No. 5, with the understanding that the proposed land use must comply with the permitted uses listed in the City's Land Use Table under the M-1 zoning designation.

# Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

# **Henry County Schools**

#### And

# **Locust Grove Police Department**

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU or "Agreement") is made and entered into effective as of the 2 day of January 2023, by and between Henry County School District, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia, by and through the Henry County Board of Education, 33 N. Zack Hinton Pkwy, McDonough, GA 30253 ("Henry County Schools") and Locust Grove Police Department, 3640 Highway 42, Locust Grove, GA 30248, individually as a "Party" and collectively the "Parties".

### RECITALS

WHEREAS, Henry County Schools has an interest in mitigating negative impacts of exposure to trauma by providing support and on-site, trauma focused interventions by school and staff and/or mental health providers as needed, to children identified by local law enforcement and school personnel; and

WHEREAS, this initiative is to function as a catalyst to provide identified children who are exposed to trauma, trauma focused interventions; and

WHEREAS, this initiative provides law enforcement final judgement, therefore, should a law enforcement officer be uncertain as to whether or not to give notice to the school, judgement should be exercised in favor of notification; and

WHEREAS, Henry County Schools and Locust Grove Police Department Initiative enter into this Agreement that directly addresses the goal of mitigating negative impacts of exposure to trauma when it does occur by communicating directly to and with local law enforcement agencies and Henry County Schools designees.

Now, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises, the covenants set forth herein contained and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

#### AGREEMENT

Accordingly, Henry County Schools, Locust Grove Police Department agree as follows:

# I. Scope

- A. Henry County Schools Responsibilities:
  - Receive Handle with Care notification(s) and disseminate them to the designated point of contact within each school
  - Upon receipt of a Handle with Care notification, which identifies a child who has been exposed to trauma, the designated point of contact persons within each school will consider the need(s) of such child, then disseminate any subsequent targeted notification(s) to appropriate teachers, social workers, school counselors, and any other relevant staff, as needed.
  - Provide the identified student(s), who are exhibiting behaviors that are not consistent with their normal manner, a safe person and space where they can receive additional supports.
  - Determine need for on-going in-school counseling or other intervention, if the student is not currently connected to mental health services.
  - If necessary, the school may contact parents or guardians to obtain appropriate consents for on-going mental health services for the student.
  - Provide education on trauma informed care to identified school personnel and to parents and guardians.
  - Maintain Handle with Care notifications including any related confidential social worker and/or counselor records for any purposes consistent with this MOU or student health and safety, but shall not make any part of the student's permanent record unless required to do so by law.

### B. Locust Grove Police Office Responsibilities:

- Send a Handle with Care notification to the Henry County Schools designee identifying any child(ren) that have been immediately present for law enforcement interactions or otherwise exposed to violence or trauma in the community (e.g. overnight incidents or days school is closed), by following the notification protocol as outlined below:
  - Notification shall be given by sending an email to <u>handlewithcare@henry.k12.ga.us</u>, stating the child's name, approximate age, school attended if known, the approximate time of the event, and the acronym HWC.
  - Such Handle with Care notifications shall be maintained in a confidential and sensitive manner, consistent with law and/or the organization's confidentiality practices.

- Such Handle with Care notifications only shall be discussed on a need to know basis, limited to the designated Henry County Schools point of contact, the point of contact persons within each school, or other targeted individual(s).
- C. The total cost of products and services to be provided under this Agreement is anticipated at \$0.00.

# II. Designees and Representatives

Each party will appoint a person to serve as the designated contact representative for their organization and who will facilitate and coordinate activities between the parties. The initial appointee of each organization is:

For Henry County Schools: Ms. Jessica Stormer Executive Director of Student Services, Henry County Schools Jessica.stormer@henry.k12.ga.us 770-957-6601

For Locust Grove Police Department: Chief Derrick B. Austin Chief of Police daustin@locustgrove-ga.gov 770-957-7055

From time to time, the parties may modify the above-listed representatives through execution of separate addenda, which, although made subsequent to this agreement, shall be incorporated fully herein.

## III. Terms

- A. Period. The Agreement shall last for one (1) year from the effective date of the Agreement. It shall be automatically renewed from successive one (1) year term unless either Party provides written notice of termination at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date of each term. This MOU may be terminated with 30 days' advanced written notice from either party. Upon the provision of notice of termination of this Agreement by a party, the parties shall work collaboratively and in good faith to ensure that the effective date of any termination is sufficiently delayed to avoid any undue hardship or deprivation of essential experience for Henry County residents.
- B. Compliance with Laws. It is the intention of the parties to comply with all federal and state laws, rules and regulations relating to Henry County Residents, including, but not limited to as applicable, educational records as provided for under the

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA), 20 U.S.C. § 12321h; the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; the American with Disabilities Act; the Georgia Student Data Privacy, Accessibility, and Transparency Act (O.C.G.A. § 20-2-660 et seq.) (SDA), and any and all subsequently enacted laws, rules or regulations. In the event any portion of this Agreement violates any law, rule or regulation, then the parties shall take all steps necessary to bring this Agreement into compliance including, if necessary, terminating this Agreement.

- C. Compliance with Policies and Procedures. In connection with activities conducted on Henry County Schools premises, Locust Grove Police Department shall ensure that its personnel are informed of and adhere to all applicable policies of Henry County Schools, including but not limited to administrative policies, confidentiality policies, policies related to conflicts of interest, operations policies, and any such other applicable policy made public on Henry County Schools website.
- D. Records. All records produced by employees or other personnel in connection with Henry County Schools shall remain the property of Henry County Schools. Locust Grove Police Department acknowledge and agree that Henry County Schools is obligated to timely comply with requests for information pursuant to state and federal laws and regulation, including the Georgia Open Records Act ("GORA"). O.C.G.A. § 50-18-70 et seq. Henry County Schools will comply with GORA at its discretion and is not required to notify Locust Grove Police Department prior to compliance. Locust Grove Police Department also agrees to comply with GORA and to make records subject to GORA, as determined by Henry County Schools, available for inspection as required by law, unless otherwise exempt under other provisions of the GORA.
- E. Non-Exclusive Relationship. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as limiting the right of either party to affiliate, partner, or to contract with other educational systems, programs, or professional development entities on either a limited or general basis while this Agreement is in effect.
- F. Authority and Control. The parties shall have the exclusive control of policies, management, assets, and affairs of their respective facilities. Neither party by virtue of this Agreement assumes any liability for any debts or obligation of a financial, legal, or moral nature incurred by the other party, and neither party may obligate the other financially or otherwise with respect to their programs. Locust Grove Police Department shall maintain full authority, control and oversight of all of their respective programs and shall maintain accountability for conduct of Locust Grove Police Department employees, agents, and/or representatives.
- G. Responsibility for Damages. Each party agrees that it shall be responsible for all demands, claims, damages to persons and/or property, losses or liabilities, including reasonable attorney fees arising out of or caused by only its own negligence or intentional misconduct, if and to the extent it is determined by a court of competent

- jurisdiction that such claim, damage, loss, liability (and related expenses) is the responsibility of such party.
- H. Use of Name and Logo. Except as may be required by law, neither party nor its affiliates shall use the name (including the trade, assumed or true name) or logo of the other party or any affiliate of such party in any advertising, promotional or other materials, on any letterhead or other form or other printed documents without the advance written express consent of the other party.
- I. Third Party Beneficiary. This Agreement is not a third-party beneficiary contract, and confers no rights upon any student, employee or contractor of either party. In particular, any personnel assigned to Henry County Schools facilities shall not otherwise be considered employees of Henry County Schools and shall not be covered, by virtue of this Agreement, by any of the employee benefit programs of Henry County Schools, including but not limited to health insurance, unemployment compensation, sickness and accident disability insurance, or worker's compensation.
- J. Waiver. The waiver by either party of a breach or violation of any provision of this Agreement shall not operate as or be construed to be a waiver of any subsequent breach of this Agreement or any provision hereof. Nothing contained in this Agreement is intended to be a waiver in any respect whatsoever of Henry County Schools' right to assert under any circumstances whatsoever its claims of sovereign, governmental, or official immunity from any liability or damages asserted against it by any natural person or entities created by law. To the extent Locust Grove Police Department purports to require Henry County Schools to indemnify or hold harmless Locust Grove Police Department, such provisions are null and void. To the extent any of Locust Grove Police Department document contains a representation or warranty made by Henry County Schools, such provisions are null and void.
- K. Severability. If any portion of this Agreement shall for any reason be invalid, illegal, unenforceable, or otherwise inoperative, the valid and enforceable provisions will continue to be given effect and to bind the parties. All rights and remedies conferred under this Agreement or by any other instrument or law shall be cumulative, and may be exercised singularly or concurrently. Failure by Henry County Schools to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of future enforcement of that or any provision.
- L. Applicable Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia without regard to conflicts of laws principles. The exclusive venue for any action arising out of or related to this Agreement shall be in the federal, superior, or state courts of Henry County, Georgia. Henry County Schools does not agree to any alternative dispute resolution process.
- M. Entire Agreement. This Agreement, together with any Exhibits referred to herein and attached hereto, embodies the entire agreement of the parties as to this subject

matter and supersedes any previous oral or written negotiations and/or agreement(s). Henry County Schools and Locust Grove Police Department hereby waive and mutually release each other from any and all prior representations, negotiations or agreements not embodied in this Agreement. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by an authorized representative of Henry County Schools.

- N. Assignment. Neither Party shall assign, transfer or otherwise alienate this Agreement or any right or duty thereunder without the prior written consent of the other Party.
- O. Headings. The headings and other titles contained in this Agreement are for reference purposes only and shall not affect in any way the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.
- P. Amendment. This Agreement may be modified only upon mutual consent in writing by authorized representatives of Henry County Schools and Locust Grove Police Department.
- Q. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which, when taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Signatures sent by facsimile or electronic transmission shall be deemed to be originals for all purposes of this Agreement.
- R. Authority. By signing this memorandum of understanding, it is implied that the parties shall strive to reach, to the best of their ability, the objectives stated in the MOU. Each party represents and warrants that it has obtained all necessary authorizations and consents from its governing body or any applicable committee thereof to enter into and perform under this Agreement.

# HANDLE WITH CARE: HENRY COUNTY

The "Handle With Care" is an initiative with a mission of helping children achieve academic success. When a first responder identifies a child at the scene of a traumatic event, the child's name and three words, "Handle with Care", is forwarded to the school system as a "heads up" before the school bell rings the next day. This allows the school and mental healthcare leaders to provide trauma-sensitive support immediately!





# The Issue: Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) & Childhood Trauma

- ⇒ Prolonged exposure to violence and trauma or ACEs (such as domestic violence and abuse) can cause toxic stress and seriously undermine the children's ability to focus, behave appropriately, learn and achieve academic success.
- ⇒ 60% of U.S. children has been exposed to violence, crime, or abuse.
- ⇒ 40% are direct victims of two or more violent acts.



# The Solution: Handle With Care

- 1. First Responders encounters a child at the scene and notify the school. to triage the Handle with Care Law Enforcement officers are trained to send a confidential notification to the school with the child's name, age, school, and "Handle with Care" message. Details about the traumatic incident is not shared with the school or any other agency.
  - 2. The School creates a protocol notification. The protocol involves notifying the appropriate teacher, counselor, social worker, and in some cases the SRO to observe the student's behavior and academic performance and responsibly react and prepare a trauma-sensitive support.
- 3. Mental Health Providers partner to provide additional support to the student and families in situations where the school intervention is not sufficient.





# The Training and Implementation in Henry County

The law enforcement, first responders, school system, mental health providers, and other stakeholders will form a partnership to launch and implement the Handle with Care Henry County program, using examples and necessary resources used by Handle With Care model from West Virginia Center for Children's Justice as well as many other states in the U.S.



Raise Me Up Foundation (in partnership with the Georgia Center for Child Advoca-ME OP CY) will provide continuing education training, Connections Matter, regarding Childhood Trauma, ACEs, and Building Resiliency. (Approved for 4 hours of CEUs: LPCs, LMFTs, LCSW, POST, and Bright from the Start)



### THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCUST GROVE HEREBY ORDAINS

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Amendment of the Police Standard Operating Procedures. The Mayor and Council hereby amend the Standard Operating Procedures of the City of Locust Grove Police Department by creating Section I-037 which is attached hereto and incorporated into the Code by reference and herein as **Exhibit "A"**. A copy of said SOP, as amended, shall be maintained in the office of Chief of Police and the office of City Clerk.

**SECTION 2.** Codification. This Ordinance shall be codified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State of Georgia.

# **SECTION 4.** Severability.

- A. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are and were, upon their enactment, believed by the City Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.
- B. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other Section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the City Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other Section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.
- C. In the event that any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the City Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining Sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable, and of full force and effect.

SECTION 5. Repeal of Conflicting Provision. Except as otherwise provided herein, all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption by the Mayor and Council of the City of Locust Grove.

This general order establishes this department's position on the utility and management of unmanned aircraft systems and provides guidance on its management, administration, and oversight.

## **Policy**

It shall be the policy of the Locust Grove Police Department to ensure that the agency continues to carry out its law enforcement and national security missions while respecting individuals' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties when utilizing the UAS. It will also help ensure an appropriate level of accountability and transparency. This policy does not replace, and is complementary to, the Federal Aviation Administration rules and regulations that control each UAS deployed and help ensure the safe operations of all aircraft, including UAS.

## I. Definitions

Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) - An aircraft that is intended to navigate in the air without an on-board pilot. Also called Remote Piloted Aircraft and "drones".

UAS Flight Crewmember- A pilot, visual observer, or other person assigned duties for a UAS for the purpose of flight.

Unmanned Aircraft Pilot (Pilot in Command) – A person exercising control over an unmanned aircraft during flight.

## II. General Procedures

A. UAS will only be operated and governed by personnel, both pilots and crew members, who have been trained in the operation of the system.

Locust Grove Police Department UAS pilots will possess an FAA Part 107

Commercial Drone Pilot License and adhere to all license requirements.

- B. All agency personnel with UAS responsibilities will be provided with training in the policies and procedures governing their use. Mandatory equipment checks will be conducted bi-weekly by the UAS personnel and logged into the aircraft logbook.
- C. All flights will be approved by the Chief of Police or his designee and must be for a legitimate public safety mission, training, investigation, or demonstration purposes.
- D. All flights will be documented in the aircraft logbook for, and all flights times shall be accounted for in the aircraft logbook. Logbooks are to be completed by the pilot and retained with the UAS.
- E. All flights logs will be made available to the public upon request, as governed by the Georgia Open Records Act.
- F. Unauthorized use of a UAS will result in strict accountability and disciplinary actions. Failure to comply with the standard operating procedures of the Locust Grove Police Department and FAA Part 107 licensing requirements will result in disciplinary action up to and including termination based upon the severity of the infraction.
- G. UAS equipment will only be deployed using a minimum of (1) one pilot and (1) safety officer.

### III. Image Retention

Unless required as evidence of a crime or required by law, images captured utilizing UAS should not be retained by the agency.

## IV. Storage

Unmanned Aircraft System will be stored in the pilot's issued vehicle or secured in the Locust Grove Police Department Criminal Investigation Unit Office.

### V. Launch and Recovery

The UAS is intended to be operated from 0' Actual Ground Level (AGL) to no greater than 400' AGL. The procedure for a typical Launch and Recovery is described below:

### Aircraft Launch Checklist:

1. Physically inspect aircraft to insure air worthiness.

- 2. Select an open area clear of immediate obstacles.
- 3. Clear the area of any unnecessary/unauthorized personnel.
- 4. Pilot and Command (PIC) and Observer scan the area and sky to confirm take-off conditions are clear.
- 5. UAS is placed on the ground and powered on.
- 6. Observer and PIC once again recheck the immediate area and sky.
- 7. If clear for take-off, the PIC clearly announces "Take-off" and engages motors.
- 8. PIC brings aircraft into a stable hover at approximately 6' off the ground and checks all flight controls, scans battery voltages and datalink signal strength.
- 9. During flight, both the observer and PIC scan the sky and note any aircraft, aerial obstacles or weather that could cause a safety hazard. PIC constantly scans telemetry data from the aircraft, monitoring battery voltages, RF signal quality, altitude, and GPS data.

# **Aircraft Recovery Checklist:**

Vertical Take-Off and Landing (VTOL) the landing and recovery typically takes place at the same location as take-off.

- 1. The PIC and observer clear the area of any unnecessary people.
- 2. PIC clearly announces "landing".
- 3. UAS transitions into hover over target landing spot and the aircraft lands.
- 4. UAS is powered off

## VI. Visual Surveillance Detection Capability

- 1. The UAS is equipped with front LED and rear LED lights.
- 2. Before any operation is executed both the observer and Pilot in Command (PIC) will discuss and rehearse the flight or training exercise to be executed.

- 3. During operation at least one observer will be used alongside or in radio communications with the PIC.
- 4. In flight the observer will communicate any air traffic or alert the PIC to any obstacles nearby or approaching through the course of the flight.
- 5. The PIC also has the benefit of live video displayed through his/her control unit. The pilot can not only fly the aircraft but also control the camera.

### VII. Communications

The proposed flight operations area is in Class G airspace. The requested flight operations ceiling is 400' AGL so no FAA radio communications are required. The Locust Grove Police Department will not operate the UAS in controlled airspace.

# VIII. Deployment

All deployments of the UAS must be specifically authorized by the Criminal Investigations Commander or the Chief of Police. The use of UAS is to provide an aerial visual perspective in responding to emergency situations and exigent circumstances, and for the following objectives:

- Situational Awareness: To assist decision makers (e.g., incident command staff; first responders; city, county, and state officials) in understanding the nature, scale, and scope of an incident—and for planning and coordinating an effective response.
- Search and Rescue: To assist missing person investigations, AMBER Alerts, Mattie's Calls, and other search and rescue missions.
- Tactical Deployment: To support the tactical deployment of officers and equipment in emergency situations (e.g., incidents involving hostages and barricades, support for large-scale tactical operations, and other temporary perimeter security situations).

- 4. <u>Visual Perspective</u>: To provide an aerial visual perspective to assist officers in providing direction for crowd control, traffic incident management, special circumstances, and temporary perimeter security.
- 5. <u>Scene Documentation</u>: To document a crime scene, accident scene, or other major incident scene (e.g., disaster management, incident response, large-scale forensic scene investigation).

# IX. Request for UAS Operations:

All requests for UAS operations will be made through the Criminal Investigation Commander or the Chief of Police. Requests for support from other government agencies shall be forwarded to the Chief of Police for consideration and approval.

# X. Emergency

- A. In the event of an emergency, the situation will be broadcast by the observer to ground personnel. The broadcast will indicate the nature of the emergency, any immediate action plans/directives and/or request for resources.
- B. Of greatest importance is ground personnel and civilian safety. It is the responsibility of the ground personnel to protect any civilians(s) that may encounter the aircraft.
- C. In the event of an emergency landing in a safe zone the PIC will communicate the situation to the observer. The nature of the emergency will be clearly communicated to the Chief of Police. A detailed report of the incident, including photos, will be completed as soon as reasonably possible.

Attached is the Final Budget Ordinance Amendment for the 4th Quarter of 2022 with all items known from our closeout over January in terms of final payables and accrued revenues. This will be entered into the system to give a final statement for our accounting and audit consultants as part of our financial audit. There may be some last-minute corrections for coding; however, the essential totals are complete. The overall budget looks good, with increases in most of the General Operating Funds due to increased revenue sources (LMIG, Insurance Premium Tax) along with increased collections in SPLOST and T-SPLOST. The Enterprise funds showed overall decreases in delayed expenditures or continued staffing shortages in those areas, with exception to Hotel/Motel (with actual 2022 revenues coming in nearly \$1.2 million). Finally, the development-related funds had decreases due to a slowdown in the residential development community overall across the country. Overall, it was a positive operating period.

# **Recommendation:**

Approve Ordinance for the 4th and Final Quarter FY 2022 Budget Adjustments to provide for orderly close out of the fiscal year and installation of the new FY 2023 Budget.

#### **Discussion:**

A 270-day moratorium on accepting new rezoning applications for multifamily developments allows time to review and revise the City's Comprehensive Plan, which is currently underway, through an agreement with the Atlanta Regional Commission. This will just bar new applications for rezoning and any revisions / modifications to existing properties zoned.

The City Council has already directed staff to examine changes to the city's Residential Growth Regulation Ordinance by re-evaluating permissible densities to ensure multi-family residential development occurs in a manner consistent with sound planning principals and the accepted policies of the City contained the Comprehensive Plan and the LCI Study as well as incorporating zoning districts not originally enumerated in the 2003 ordinance.

#### **Recommendation:**

Staff recommends APPROVAL of the Moratorium Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT A MORATORIUM ON ACCEPTING REZONING APPLICATIONS, FOR THE CREATION OF NEW MULTI-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS IN THE CITY FOR A PERIOD OF TWO-HUNDRED SEVENTY (270)) DAYS; TO ESTABLISH A PUBLIC PURPOSE TO BE SERVED BY THE MORATORIUM; TO REPEAL INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

**WHEREAS**, the City of Locust Grove (the "City") has been vested with substantial powers, rights and functions to generally regulate the practice, conduct or use of property for the purposes of maintaining health, morals, safety, security, peace, and the general welfare of the City of Locust Grove; and,

WHEREAS, Georgia law recognizes that local governments may impose moratoria on zoning decisions, building permits, and other development approvals where exigent circumstances warrant to the same, pursuant to case law found at <u>City of Roswell v. Outdoor Systems, Inc.</u>, 274 Ga. 130 (2001); <u>Taylor v. Shetzen</u>, 212 Ga. 101 (1955); <u>Lawson v. Macon</u>, 214 Ga. 278 (1958); and,

WHEREAS, the Georgia Supreme Court, in the case of <u>DeKalb County v. Townsend</u>, 243 Ga. 80 (1979), held that, "[T]o justify a moratorium, it must appear first, that the interests of the public generally, as distinguished from those of a particular class, require such interference; and second that the means are reasonably necessary for the accomplishment of the purpose, and not unduly oppressive upon individuals;" and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council are, and have been interested in developing a cohesive and coherent policy regarding development in the City, and have intended to promote community development through stability, predictability and balanced growth which will further the prosperity of the City as a whole; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council therefore consider it paramount that land use continue in the most orderly and predictable fashion with the least amount of disturbance to landowners and to the citizens of the City of Locust Grove.

WHEREAS, The Mayor and Council have always had a strong interest in growth management so as to promote the traditional police power goals of health, safety, morals, and the general welfare of the community, including safety to pedestrians, the bicycling and driving public of the City, and to facilitate of the adequate provision of transportation and other public infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, it is the belief of the Mayor and Council of the City of Locust Grove that the concept of "public welfare" is broad and inclusive and includes, but is not limited to, the valid public objectives of aesthetic conservation; preservation of the value of existing lands and buildings within the City, making the most appropriate use of resources, preserving existing neighborhood and downtown characteristics, enhancing and protecting the economic well-being

of the community, facilitating adequate provision of public services, and the preservation of the resources of the City.

**NOW THEREFORE** be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Locust Grove and by the authority of same:

#### SECTION I.

The preamble of this Ordinance shall be considered to be and is hereby incorporated by reference as if fully set out herein.

#### **SECTION II.**

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- A. The City of Locust Grove adopted the *Multi-family residence district* as part of the zoning ordinance contained within the <u>Code of Ordinances</u>, <u>City of Locust Grove</u>, <u>Georgia</u>, <u>Section 17.04.060</u> on June 6, 2022 (the "RM Ordinance").
- B. Since adoption of the most recent RM Ordinance, the City has entered into an agreement with the Atlanta Regional Commission to update the City's Comprehensive Land Use Plan (the "Comp Plan") as required by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs.
- C. The City is contemplating amending the Comp Plan to re-evaluate permissible densities and development standards to ensure multi-family residential development occurs in a manner consistent with sound planning principals and the accepted policies of the City.
- D. In addition to the upcoming Comp Plan update, the City is further compelled to examine amending the Residential Growth Regulation Ordinance (the "Growth Ordinance") to reevaluate permissible quantities of housing types (single-family, multi-family, and mobile home) as a percentage of the City's overall housing supply due to changes in the City's R-3 and RM Ordinances as well as the PR-4 and PR-5 zoning classifications.
- E. Any necessary changes to the City's RM Ordinance and Growth Ordinance resulting from this Comp Plan update will be sent to the Mayor and Council for final adoption prior to codification.
- F. To this end, in consultation with the City Attorney, the City shall take those steps necessary to protect the rights of the public in an equitable and effective manner, while simultaneously promoting aesthetics, traffic safety, public health, safety and public welfare. In light of certain requirements imposed by state law, the City Charter, and local ordinance, the City calculates that such efforts will take not less than two-hundred seventy three-hundred sixty-five (270) days.
- G. In an effort to narrowly restrict the impact of the moratorium to achieve the compelling interests mentioned above, the City will limit the scope of the moratorium to the acceptance of applications for rezoning for RM multi-family residential developments within the City, including any amendments or modification to existing property(ies) previously zoned RM.

This moratorium shall not apply to developments governed by legally executed development agreements with the City or any commercial, non-residential projects.

#### **SECTION III.**

#### **MORATORIUM**

- A. The Mayor and Council does hereby enact a moratorium for two-hundred seventy three-hundred sixty-five (270) days from 11:59 PM. on February 6, 2023 to bar the acceptance of applications for zoning map amendment for rezoning for RM multi-family residential developments within the City, including any amendments or modification to existing property(ies) previously zoned RM. During this 270-day moratorium period, no applications for any zoning map amendment, of any kind shall be accepted by the City of Locust Grove or any of its Departments located within the city limits of Locust Grove, Georgia. Any such applications tendered and/or submitted to the City of Locust Grove or any of its Departments during this moratorium period shall not be accepted, considered, nor acted upon by the City of Locust Grove or any of its Departments. Any application so accepted for filing will be deemed in error, null and void and of no effect whatsoever and shall constitute no assurance whatsoever of any right to engage in any act, and any action in reliance on any such permit or approval shall be unreasonable.
- B. The duration of this moratorium shall be until the City adopts a revision of the Comp Plan of the City of Locust Grove or until the expiration of two-hundred seventy (270) days from the date of adoption of this Ordinance, whichever first occurs; or until such time as may be later set by the City.
- C. This moratorium shall have no effect upon approvals zoning map amendments previously issued prior to the effective date of this Ordinance. Notwithstanding the foregoing sentence, the City recognizes that, unbeknownst to the City, de facto vesting may have occurred in some instances. Under Cannon v. Clayton County, 255 Ga. 63, 335 S.E.2d 294 (1985); Meeks v. City of Buford, 275 Ga. 585, 571 S.E.2d 369 (2002); City of Duluth v. Riverbroke Props., 233 Ga. App. 46, 502 S.E.2d 806 (1998), the Georgia Supreme Court has held that "[w]here a landowner makes a substantial change in position by expenditures and reliance on the probability of the issuance of a building permit, based upon an existing zoning ordinance and the assurances of zoning officials, he acquires vested rights and is entitled to have the permit issued despite a change in the zoning ordinance which should otherwise preclude the issuance of a permit." Accordingly, the following procedure is established to provide consideration of an exemption request from this moratorium where a claim of legal vesting is made:

- i. A written application shall be submitted to the Locust Grove City Council, with verified supporting data, documents and facts which the Applicant feels supports a claim of legal vesting. Such information will be reviewed by the Locust Grove City Council and approved/denied within thirty (30) days of submission in a public meeting. During this 30-day timeframe, additional facts and data may be requested on behalf of the Locust Grove City Council by its staff to further the review process.
- ii. Should the Applicant fail to provide requested information or otherwise fail to cooperate during the review process, the exemption request will be denied. If the information provided fails to support a claim of legally vested rights, the exemption request will be denied.
- iii. Any exemption granted by the Locust Grove City Council shall merely grant the Applicant the right to have City Staff accept and process the underlying application in accordance with all existing City and State laws.

#### SECTION IV.

- A. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are or were, upon their enactment, believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.
- B. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every sections, paragraph, sentence, clause of this Ordinance is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that to the greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other section, paragraph, section, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.
- C. In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the Mayor and Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionally or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of this Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable, and of full force and effect.

#### SECTION V.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby replaced.

# SECTION VI.

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption.
